TRACTOR WARNING LABELS


- 1) YOU'LL NEED THE MODEL AND SERIAL NUMBER OF YOUR TRACTOR
- 2) FIND A DEALERSHIP NEAR YOU!
- 3) GIVE THE MODEL AND SERIAL NUMBER TO YOUR LOCAL DEALERSHIP CUSTOMER SERVICE REPRESENTATIVE

Most tractors, such as this Case IH, on the left will have the serial number and model in a convenient and easy to see place.



On the upper right is a photo of a Massey Ferguson that can help you identify where the information will be.

With the serial number, you will need to find the dealership model chart to find out the specific year and model.
